THE MICHAEL PRIOR MEMORIAL EDUCATIONAL FUND

The Revd Professor Michael Prior C.M. died suddenly in July 2004. Vincentian priest and academic, he was also a stalwart, fearless and vocal supporter of the rights of Palestinians, and a founder and chairman of Living Stones. The reaction to his death has been one of deep sadness and loss. Such has been the strength of the response of his many friends and colleagues, coupled with a powerful wish to see his name and work perpetuated, that Living Stones has established a memorial educational fund in his memory.

1. The primary purpose of the Fund will be to promote the development of higher academic studies among Palestinians, particularly in the following areas:

- Contextual Palestinian Christian theology
- Holy Land Studies
- Contextual pilgrimage and tourism in the Holy Land

2. Your generosity may help in:

—The provision of scholarships and bursaries for undergraduate or postgraduate students who have been accepted by accredited universities anywhere in the world for courses in one of the above areas of study. For example, the total expenses for a year's study abroad is about \$40,000.

—The financing of research fellowships or lectureships in an appropriate area of study at a partner institution of higher education in the Middle East. Again, some \$40,000 per year

—Financing a first degree or masters student in Theology/Religious Studies and/or Tourism at Bethlehem University is \$3,500 for the first degree (BA). A master's degree in Palestine would cost about \$5,000 per year.
